Darby's sentencing delayed

Former Summit Security Guard Reginald Darby was not sentenced last Friday because the probation report for his sentencing was not in order, according to Gloria Montecallegre of the Manhattan District Attorney's office.

Darby is accused of the Feb. 17 rape of a Columbia College first-year student. Darby allegedly entered her seventh-floor room in McBain Hall at 3:55 a.m. and raped her while holding a knife to her throat.

Darby turned himself in to the New York City Police Department Feb. 18, and was charged with rape, attempted sodomy, and assault.

On July 10, the *Manhattan Lawyer* reported that Darby will receive a minimum of four to twelve years and a maximum of five to fifteen years in prison because he agreed to take an AIDS test.

The statutory maximum sentence for first degree rape is eight and a half to 25 years, according to the *Manhattan Lawyer*.

Darby will be sentenced September 3, according to Montecallegre.
